Among biblical texts, the Letter of James is one of the most direct in its description of the causes of war and injustice. James does not blame the devil, unjust authority, or outside forces. Envy, greed, and ambition are at the heart of much of the world's trouble. James' identification of the sin in our lives provides a lens through which we might view all three readings. The picture of the wicked sketched in the verses we read today is fleshed out in the entire second chapter of Wisdom. There we are shown wild desire for the things of this world. In the Gospel, the disciples argue about who is the greatest among them. This dispute underscores the disciples' ignorance of Jesus' mission. Envy demands a better position, greed desires wealth, and ambition seeks power. To be true disciples of Christ, we must set aside these things and open ourselves to the fruits of wisdom and the spirit.
