Sunday, October 19, 2025 – Daily Reflection: *Pray always without becoming weary. (Luke 18:1)*

Jesus’ words in today’s Gospel can sound impossible: *Pray always? Without growing weary?* How can we do that? It’s so easy to grow weary in prayer, especially in those situations when God seems slow to answer. How do we not give up? What can we do when prayer feels hard and unanswered? Our readings tell us to be open to receiving help from your brothers and sisters. In the first reading, Moses lifts up his staff in prayer on a mountaintop while Joshua and his army battle Israel’s enemy, the Amalekites, in the valley below. But Moses begins to grow weary, so Aaron and Hur support his arms so that he (Moses) can keep praying. Because of his friends, Moses was able to persist, and that gave Israel the advantage over their enemy. It’s not always easy to ask for help, but asking someone to pray for us or with us opens the door to God’s grace! A friend OR the Blessed Mother or a Saint CAN intercede for us and offer support when we are tired and weary. In the second reading, Paul offers words of encouragement to his young disciple, Timothy. Paul senses his martyrdom is near, so he urges his friend to rely on something that is undying: the Word of God. “All Scripture,” he says, “is inspired by God”. Scripture has divine power and can bring us hope when we are weary. It can bolster our faith and fill our minds with God’s truth. When we want to give up, we can remember, “My help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.” Whenever we struggle in prayer, we can ask God for his strength. Jesus himself intercedes for us, and the Spirit helps us in our weakness. So BE relentless and persistent in prayer! God is always here to help us; it may not be when we want it, but he’s our Loving Father and he will answer. ***Lord, teach me to remain prayerful all day long!***

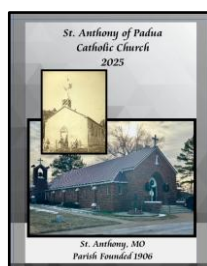

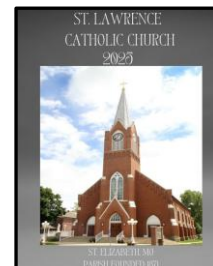

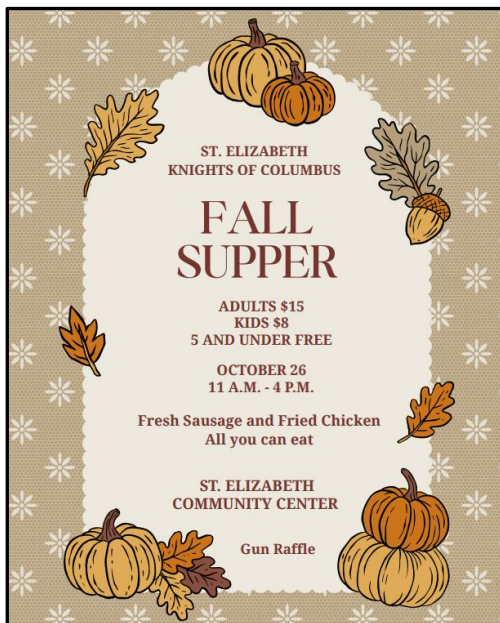

"How can I repay the Lord for all of the great good He has done for me?" This passage from Psalm 116 is one of my favorite Scripture verses, it is the one that immediately comes to my mind when I reflect on the Stewardship Way of Life and what it means to be a good steward of the gifts God has blessed me with. In fact, this is what stewardship is all about, recognizing our gifts, talents, spiritual and material blessings and putting them at the service of God, His Church and one's neighbor. When I recognize my gifts and use them to serve God and others, there is a joy, a peace and a fulfillment that cannot often be put into words, but is very real indeed.

My Dear Friends in Christ, everything we have is a gift from God, and with grateful hearts we share God's love with others by making appropriate use of those gifts; this is what it means to be a "Stewardship Parish".

Time, talent and treasure are the three areas of giving we consider in a Stewardship Way of Life. What does it mean to put God first in our life? It means making time for God by praying and by participating in the Sacraments of the Church, utilizing our unique skills and abilities, to give of what is most precious to us. Of course, we must learn how to appropriately balance our time with family, work, parish community, and relaxation. It is a challenge in a busy world, but there is much in the spiritual tradition of the Church and in the lives of the Saints, to help us focus on the present moment and the person in front of us, rather than to be paralyzed by the past.

There are various ways to share our talents with our faith community, and annually, during October, our parishioners participate in the Catholic Stewardship Renewal by prayerfully assessing and considering where and how they can better contribute to their parish. The attached Time and Talent Form provides a listing of the various ministries and volunteer opportunities at each parish. These ministries and opportunities come with mentors and leaders who will help guide you as you learn your new parish role.

One of the most frequently asked questions in regard to stewardship is "How much do I have to give?" This is actually not the correct question, rather, we should be asking, "How much is God calling me to give of myself and my gifts for the sake of the Church and the glory of God?" This is the question a steward asks. That means giving proportionately, as we are able, sacrificially and generously, with the goal being the Biblical Tithe of ten percent; goal, not "requirement." Saint Paul says in his Second Letter to the Corinthians, "Whoever sows sparingly will reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will reap bountifully. Each one must give what they have decided in their heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:6-7).

In the past years, we have been fortunate to receive new volunteers who are willing to give of their time and talents to help us fulfill our Stewardship mission. From CCD Teacher, Rosary Leader, Lector, Eucharistic Minister, Musicians/Adult and Youth Choir Member, Server, Sacristan, St. Ann's/Knights of Columbus and more, these ministries and community opportunities can offer personal fulfillment and eternal reward.

Therefore my friends, with you, I give heartfelt thanks for the beloved Sacraments of the Church; Baptism, Reconciliation (Confession), Holy Eucharist (First Communion), Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony. For in faithfully participating in these Sacraments, it provides us with the graces we need to become the person God has called us to be.

In closing, please prayerfully review the Stewardship 2025 Time and Talent Form and consider how you and your family can deepen and express faith by participation in the mission of your Catholic family.

May God bless each of you, your families and our Parish.

Stewardship Expectations

Discipleship calls us to more than membership; it calls us to active stewardship. To support all the ministries of the parish, we need every family's active stewardship in the parish.

What does stewardship ask of all members of the parish?

- **Commitment to pray.** That is, actively and regularly attends Mass on weekends and Holy days of Obligation, along with a commitment to daily personal and family prayer.
- **Commitment to participate.** That is, offer their talents and a portion of their time to serve the parish community and be a part of its fellowship and opportunities for ongoing Christian formation.
- **Commitment to sacrificially give.** That is, generously and proportionately pledge a portion of the "first fruits" of material treasure to support the operation and ministry of the parish church. The goal for Christians is the Biblical tithe (10%) and all are called to strive toward that goal.

All parish families are expected to enshrine these 3 sacrificial commitments through the completion of annual Catholic Stewardship Renewal forms. In addition, parish families must strive to stay current on their commitment in order to be considered active stewards in the parish.
